DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

- 1. The story is set against the backdrop of the emerging HIV pandemic in the 1980s. How did the author effectively convey the fear and uncertainty surrounding this new and incurable disease? In what ways did the pandemic influence the characters' decisions and interactions?
- 2. Nick Jordan is faced with the challenges of his surgical internship in a time of immense stress and danger. How did his perspective on medicine and patient care evolve throughout the story? What were some pivotal moments that contributed to this evolution?
- 3. The book portrays a diverse cast of characters, each with their own quirks and struggles. Who was your favorite character, and why? How did their individual experiences add depth to the overall narrative?
- 4. The interns' camaraderie and support play a significant role in their journey. How did their friendships and connections help them cope with the pressures of medical training and the pandemic? Which friendships stood out to you the most?
- 5. The author weaves elements of romance and humor into the story. How did these lighter moments balance the heavier themes, such as illness and death? Were there specific instances that made you laugh or touched your heart?
- 6. Nick's desire to become a head and neck surgeon is central to his character. How did his passion for this specialty influence his decisions and patient interactions? In what ways did his career aspirations mirror his personal growth?
